


4th Grade

4th grade is a time of great personal and academic growth. With guidance, students begin the transition from lower elementary into upper elementary and middle school. They develop organizational skills through the use of the folder and planner.

Reading and Language Arts

This year the students branch out from the basal reader and dive into chapter books. They explore realistic fiction, historical fiction, fantasy, biography and information texts. They learn writing from sentences to short essays.



Religion

In Religion, the majority of our focus is on learning the meaning behind each of the Ten Commandments. Fourth graders also participate in our Prayer Partner program. Each student is partnered with an active member of our faith community. We exchange cards, celebrate several Masses together, and pray for each other throughout the year. We also organize three service events: winter gear drive, stocking stuffer project, and Lent's Box of Love project.



Math

Many of the skills students learned in 2nd and 3rd grade will be used this year as they learn the more intricate math skills of "long" multiplication and long division.
