OUR CATHEDRAL SCHOOL STARS

Last year we welcomed Mrs. Jaime Samraziya as our new school Principal.

Mrs. Samarziya laid out three goals for the 2018-2019 school year:

- Increase enrollment & strengthen our position in the community
- Continue the use of Google Classroom and move to 1:1 technology
- Utilize the School Safety Grant to update the safety & security of the building

We are happy to report the progress we have made in each of the areas.

- Enrollment has increased this year. While we will be graduating a small 8th grade class this year, our major growth areas have been the younger classes, including the Pre-School 3 and 4 year old classes.
- Chromebooks in Middle School allow for 1:1 technology and increased use of Google Classroom to help students prepare for our modern world.
- Through the DPI School Safety Grant we were able to:
 - Attend Adolescent Mental Health and School Threat Assessment Courses
 - Install new security cameras at all entrances
 - Implement handheld radios for all staff members which improves communication throughout the campus.

We are proud of our Middle School students this year—97% of whom are on the First Quarter Honor Roll.

TEN RENOVATED CLASSROOMS

Through the generosity of Cathedral School alumni, we were able to renovate four classrooms this summer! In addition, we decided to make the move to abate the flooring before beginning the project. While this was not required, we felt that this gave a better surface for the new flooring and was a good long term investment for our school.

We finished off the elementary floor with our Third Grade and tutoring classrooms. On the Middle School floor we were able to renovate both the Social Studies classroom and the Language Arts classroom. These classrooms will be dedicated to the memories of Steve Bachand and Dan Conway, two coaches that through their lived example, inspired Cathedral School students. The Dan Conway classroom will have a display case of his medals and memorabilia.

The updated classrooms are bright with updated energy efficient lighting, new ceiling tiles, new flooring and a fresh coat of paint.

Our goal is to work on the Middle School floor next summer with 6 more classrooms! We would love to show you the new classrooms! Please call or stop by the school and ask for a tour.

COSTS PER CLASSROOM

The Interior Renewal Project will address each of the classrooms and offices. They will be equipped with energy efficient lighting, new teaching surfaces and technology, reface the cupboards, install new flooring, doors, and paint.
