Mrs. Nielsen's fifth grade class turned sadness into action this year. After watching the devastating effects of Hurricanes Harvey, Irma and Jose, students turned in 19 pages of ideas and ways that they could help people in hurricane stricken areas.

Students decided to take up a collection of clothing, non-perishable food items, stuffed animals, diapers, hygiene supplies, and cleaning products. To date, two other schools, Cooper and Four Corners, have joined in the efforts. The fifth grade class will work with Catholic Relief Services and Catholic Charities to make sure that the donations are sent where they are needed most and in as timely a manner as possible.

Four new members were commissioned by Fr. Lee Flaherty, spiritual advisor, at the school Mass on October 4th, bringing the number of youth members to nine. These Cathedral School students are currently working on holding a winter clothing drive at Cathedral School and are also planning to create and deliver Thanksgiving baskets for families in need identified by the Society of St. Vincent de Paul. Current Minnie Vinnie adult advisors are Lynn Tracy and Sylvia Steen.

THREE CLASSROOMS UPDATED

As our Kindergarten, First, and Second Grades settle into their renewed classrooms, we look towards next summer. We will continue to update classrooms each summer as donations allow. Updated classrooms cost around \$19,000. This includes new lighting, ceiling tiles, flooring, doors, countertops, sinks, re-facing of the cabinets, and new SMARTboards.

Built in 1950-1951, the school has served our community for 65 years. During that time, the budget has only allowed for routine interior maintenance.
