## OUR CATHEDRAL SCHOOL STARS

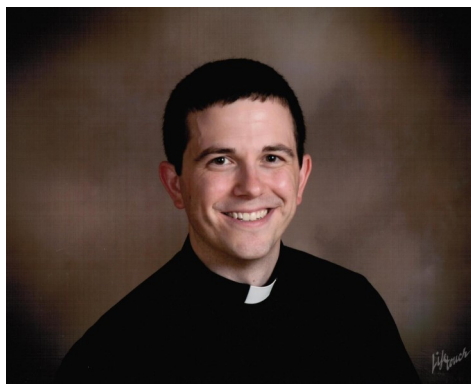

## DAN CONWAY CLASSROOM PLANNED

Educator. Coach. Elite Runner. Friend. All of these can be used to describe Dan Conway. A graduate of the class of 1957, Dan taught at the school after graduating from the University of Wisconsin Superior. Dan returned to Superior and coached the Cathedral School track team after retiring from teaching in Chetek, WI. Dan set many American and World master's running records and won the Masters division at Grandma's four times. He was named to multiple Halls of Fame, and many of his records still stand today.

As a coach and educator, Dan had a unique ability to connect with and mentor young people. He was able to encourage them to reach their full potential and developed lifelong friendships with many of the students he coached. Dan knew that running reached across socio-economic barriers; even students who did not come from affluent backgrounds could take up running.

Shortly before his death, Dan Conway contacted the school to let us know that he had planned a gift in his estate for Cathedral Middle School. Dan's gift will be used to renew two third floor classrooms next summer.

The updated classrooms are bright with updated energy efficient lighting, new ceiling tiles, new flooring and a fresh coat of paint.

## STUDENTS HELP BRING IN THE PIPE ORGAN

On September 23, 2018, school families and parishioners of Cathedral of Christ the King joined together to carry in over 1600 pipes, windchests, the console, and various parts for the new pipe organ into the church.

This new instrument is the result of hundreds of people throughout the Diocese coming together, making a sacrifice, and participating in many diverse ways to bring this pipe organ to the Cathedral.

The pipe organ will be used for weekend Masses as well as for concerts and teaching. The Cathedral hosts many diocesan and community events throughout the year and students will have the opportunity to sing with the pipe organ. Music students at the school will learn more about the pipe organ in liturgical settings as well as how it works.

The dedication Mass for the pipe organ will be 10:30 a.m. on the feast of Christ the King, November 25 with Bishop James Powers presiding.

## SCHOOL SAFETY GRANTS AWARDED

Cathedral School received two School Safety Grants from the Wisconsin Department of Justice this fall, totaling \$30,000. The first round of grant funds will be used to update school communications with a new radio system. Radios will be used by all staff, improving communication throughout the campus during drills and events, as well as safety threats.

The second round of funds will be used to update our camera system and train staff on adolescent mental health. The updated camera system ensures a visual record of every person entering the school through all entrances and the tunnel to the church. School staff members will be trained in adolescent mental health locally with members of the public school system.
