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## Attendance

- Attendance is crucial to student learning. Even a few minutes each day can add up.
- If your student will be absent or tardy, parents/guardians are required to contact the school office at 715.392.2976 by 8am each day. Please DO NOT email the office.
- If you leave a message please include your child's symptoms or confirmed diagnosis.
- If your student will need to be excused for an appointment for the day or leave early a note must be sent in or the parent must contact the office. Not the student's teacher.
- Truancy Notices will be sent out if a student has 5 or more unexcused absences or tardies in a semester.

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## Homework Policy for Student Absence

## **HOMEWORK**

Cathedral School believes homework is a valuable part of the instructional process. Homework helps

reinforce academic skills and concepts taught in the classroom, provides opportunities for practice, and

encourages students to develop time management and self-discipline. It is important that assignments

are balanced and meaningful.

To empower student growth,

Parents can...

- Arrange a quiet time and study area with proper lighting.
- Provide materials for homework such as pencils, paper, crayons, glue, and scissors.
- Review assignments in student planner with your child(ren), and review finished projects/work for accuracy and neatness.

Students can...

- Ask questions in class so the homework is clearly understood.
- Record assignments in student planners (4th - 8th grade), and take assignments and materials home.
- Complete and return homework assignments on time.
- Complete homework assigned during absences within designated time periods.

Assigned homework should be age and grade appropriate, reasonable in terms of time required to complete\*, and intended to reinforce what has been taught in the classroom. All students will have opportunities to demonstrate and extend their learning during the school year through assigned homework. Students are expected to complete and submit assigned homework and/or projects on the

assigned due date.

\*The general guideline is that homework should not exceed 10 minutes per grade level. (i.e. 2nd grade

students could have 20 minutes, 6 grade students could have 60 minutes, etc.) If your child spends substantially more or less time each day on homework than indicated, please communicate with your

child's teacher immediately.

For grades 5-8, the following Homework Policy will be enforced:

- Students will have 5% taken off the assignment's grade, each day that homework is late. (For classes that do not meet daily, past due or late homework is to be submitted to the child's homeroom teacher. Digital homework is submitted via Google Classroom.)
- Teachers will accept homework 10 calendar days past the due date or until the end of the unit, whichever comes first. The end of a unit is a summative grade, which may be defined by a Chapter Test, a final draft of an Essay, a completed Research Project etc. as determined by the teacher.
- Submitting an assignment 8 calendar days after the due date, is the last opportunity to receive a passing grade of 65%.
- After 10 calendar days or at the close of a unit, students will not receive credit for past due or late assignments. Therefore, they will receive a grade of zero (0) on that assignment.

\*\*Working summative assessments, such as final drafts of Essays or completed Research Projects may be

turned in no later than three (3) days after the due date as they are the equivalency of a test.

## **Absence & Vacation Related Homework**

Unfinished class work or work missed due to absences, although accomplished outside of the school day,

is not included in the school's definition of homework. Missed class work, as well as homework, is assigned after a student's absence. Regular school attendance is critical for student academic success.

Students who are absent are expected to complete assignments on a timely basis. Students will have two

(2) days for every one (1) day of absence to complete make-up work.

- Elementary - Students who are absent from school two (2) or more days may obtain their daily assignments by contacting the school secretary after the second day of absence.
- Middle School - Students are responsible for speaking with their teachers and gathering missed work upon their return to school.

### **Sample schedule for one (1) day absence**

#### **Vacation Related Homework**

Teachers are not expected to prepare homework in advance for a student who will not be in school due

to a family event or vacation. Therefore, teachers reserve the right to not provide requested work until

the student returns. If a teacher chooses to provide some homework, ALL assigned homework is due

upon the student's return to school.

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## **ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL PROCEDURES**

### **ARRIVAL**

**School day begins at 8:00 a.m.**

**Drop off Hours: 7:00a.m.-7:55a.m.**

**Morning Extended Care: 7:00a.m.-7:30a.m.**

**Morning Extended Care released to classroom teachers: 7:50a.m.**

Staff: Aides monitoring entryways, Teachers monitoring hallways/homerooms

7:00-7:30a.m.

All students, Preschool - 8th grade, must enter through the 14th Street doors and report directly to the gymnasium for the morning Extended Care program. Upon arrival, preschool parents need to come into school to sign their preschool child in for the day.

7:30-7:50a.m.

- Preschool Students will go to Room 108 until being released to preschool classrooms at 7:50a.m. At 7:50a.m. a school aide will bring preschool students to their respective classrooms. Upon arrival, preschool parents need to come into school to sign their preschool child in for the day.

At 7:30a.m. students may enter through either the main entrance on Baxter Avenue or through the 14th Street entrance.

- K-8th grade students may enter through the 14th Street doors or the main entrance on Baxter Avenue and proceed to the gym. At 7:50a.m. students will be released to their classes.

#### DISMISSAL

All elementary and middle school students are dismissed from school at 2:50 p.m. At that time, students who participate in Cathedral's after-school program go to the appropriate Extended Care room, and students picked up by their parents go to the front porch. Elementary and Middle School students not picked up by 3:00 p.m. will be sent to the appropriate Extended Care room and parents will be charged accordingly. Preschool students not picked up by 3:10 p.m. will be brought to the appropriate Extended Care classrooms.

- For student safety, students will ONLY be allowed to leave school property in the middle of the school day when accompanied by a parent, guardian, or person listed on that student's emergency sheet. Students cannot leave the building without a note or call from the parent. Parents may enter the school using the main entrance on Baxter and either:
    1. Use the intercom in the entryway to identify themselves and which student they are picking up.
    2. Come to the main office, sign out their son/daughter, and then wait for their child in the office.
  - Parents must notify the school when it is necessary for the student to be picked up by someone not listed on the emergency form.

**WE ENCOURAGE STUDENTS TO BE FAMILIAR WITH AND RESPONSIBLE FOR THEIR AFTER-SCHOOL ROUTINE.** Parents must call or send a note to the school office for any change in the student's normal after-school routine.
  - Due to high demands in the office, any calls with changes of your child's dismissal after 2 p.m. are not guaranteed to reach your child. Please note that messages by email to the main office after 1:30 p.m. will not be read until the next day.
  - Students not attending Extended Care should leave the building as soon as dismissed (hallways are to be cleared by 3:00 p.m.) unless under the supervision of a teacher or activity director.
  - Parents are asked NOT to park in the bus loading area on 14th Street
