- Replace the old caged lights with energy-efficient LED lighting
 - Give the gymnasium a fresh coat of paint
 - Add artwork to commemorate the decades and the vibrant history of Cathedral School

We are scheduling the work in pieces that can be done during school breaks so that students can still use the gymnasium this winter. Our next steps will be to continue to enhance this beloved space, including plans for refreshing the gymnasium floor, installing new doors, and updating the tile wall along the north side.

Cathedral School Endowment Fund

This is an Endowment Fund. The purpose of the Cathedral School Endowment Fund is restricted to the long term financial support of the Cathedral School's operational needs. Monies from this Fund may be withdrawn through the Cathedral School's annual process or as determined by the Rector with the advice and input from the Principal and the Finance Council.

Cathedral School: Tuition Assistance Fund

The purpose of this Tuition Assistance Fund is to offer financial relief to families who desire to send their children to Cathedral School and require assistance with the cost of tuition. This Fund is specifically restricted to tuition assistance, and is expended at the discretion of the Principal of Cathedral School with the prior consent of the Rector.

Cathedral School: Technology Fund

The purpose of the Technology Fund is restricted to support the technology resources utilized at Cathedral School. This includes technology infrastructure and updating resources such as computers, laptops, tablets, smart boards, and interactive digital technology. Monies from this Fund are authorized by the Principal and can be expended through the annual budget process or by the Rector.
